The Election is Over: Now What? The Care and Nurturing of Newly Elected and Re-Elected Council Members

Dr. Ryle served as City Clerk of the City of Fresno from 1967 until her retirement in 1995. She earned her CMC in 1976 and a Lifetime Distinction with IIMC Advanced Academy. She continues to work with cities and counties throughout the State, and facilitates for organizations, groups and collaboratives state-wide and nationally. She has instructed at the undergraduate and graduate levels since 1984, and has instructed in the doctoral program at Alliant International University for three years.

This will be an interactive workshop, drawing upon the experience and knowledge of the participants. It will foster an exchange of ideas and techniques, within the context of the topic. Participants will have opportunity to interact with a large variety of others, new information will be introduced, and learning and insight will be experiential and relevant.

This course will explore the relevant variables of communication, group dynamics, conflict resolution, and teambuilding, all within the context of the municipal political environment. Drawing upon relevant case studies, participants will consider techniques, concepts and practices designed to enhance the experience of working effectively with newly elected and re-elected council members, both as first time and continuing officials.
